
The ACMA is committed to providing quality individualized education to the whole student while valuing diversity and fostering community at affordable costs.


Phase 1 will include directing funds raised to purchase land/buildings, procure furniture, fixtures, classroom materials, and hire necessary teachers and administrative staff. In short, everything required to launch the first class of 4th through 6th grade in August 2017.

Phase 2 will expand on our infrastructure and resources to open and start operating a second class of 4th through 6th graders in 2018.

Phase 3 will build on the previous phases to include two classes of 6th through 9th grade in 2019 and two classes of 9th through 12th grade by 2021.
